

How to Shape Brows

Where your brow should begin:

Place pencil alongside your nose pointing up and stopping at the inner corner of your eye. Your brows should begin here. Tweeze the hairs that grow outside this area.

Where your brow should arch:

Place pencil parallel to the center of eye pupil, pointing up. The arch should begin here. Tweeze out the hairs that are not a part of the brow line at this arch. This lifts and opens the eyes.

Where your brow should end:

Place the pencil alongside the nose, line to the outer corner of your eye and stop at the end of your brow. This is where your brow should end.

How to tweeze:

Before you begin, sterilize the tip of your tweezers with rubbing alcohol. Next sterilize the area you will be tweezing with astringent. This not only removes bacteria, but also removes oils from the skin that make tweezing difficult.

For best results, draw the desired brow shape first, then brush brow hairs into desired shape. You can use a white pencil to draw over areas you want to tweeze, making it easier to see what the brows will look like when hair is removed.

Pull hairs in the direction the hair brows.

Be careful not to over tweeze.

If you do not wish to shape your brows yourself, you can have it done inexpensively by a professional.

Very thick brows should be waxed by a professional.
